The overall health and wellness of Pleasant Dale Park District guests is very important to us. As a proactive measure, based on information from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) and the Centers of Disease Control (CDC) regarding COVID-19, and in coordination with the Burr Ridge Police Department and School District 107, park district facilities will be closed from Saturday, March 14 through Sunday, April 5. The exception is that the Walker Park Recreation Center will be open for voting in the primary election on Tuesday, March 17 as scheduled. All park district programs will be suspended during this closure. We will be making appropriate adjustments to programs including possible rescheduling and/or account credits for programs that are missed. While this decision was not made lightly, the Board of Commissioners supports public health experts and wants to ensure the park district is doing its part to mitigate exposure to this novel coronavirus.

There remain no known cases of COVID-19 with any of our guests and staff. If any member of your family contracts COVID-19, please contact your local public health official as well as the park district if that person has had recent attendance at any of our locations.

During the closure, park district staff will continue with deep cleaning and sanitizing of our facility. Limited staff will be available during regular business hours.

Please continue to check the park district website as this is an extremely fluid situation and circumstances may change rapidly.

We strongly encourage best practices to prevent the spread of the virus:

- Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Cover your mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, or cough into the inside of your elbow. Throw the tissue away after you use it.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Avoid contact with people who are sick.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Stay home if you are sick and avoid contact with other people.
